## Street Patrols.

A workshop was held by the LBL Scrutiny and CPCG into Street Patrolling on 30 January. A decision in principle has been made by LBL Cabinet to cease funding Street Wardens (excepting the Wardens on the South Bank) in April and to transfer £400k to the MPS to part fund an additional 21 CPSO's. This decision has been called in for Scrutiny.

## Funding and Finance

Latest projection for end of year position still points to a reserve to cover two month's expenditure.

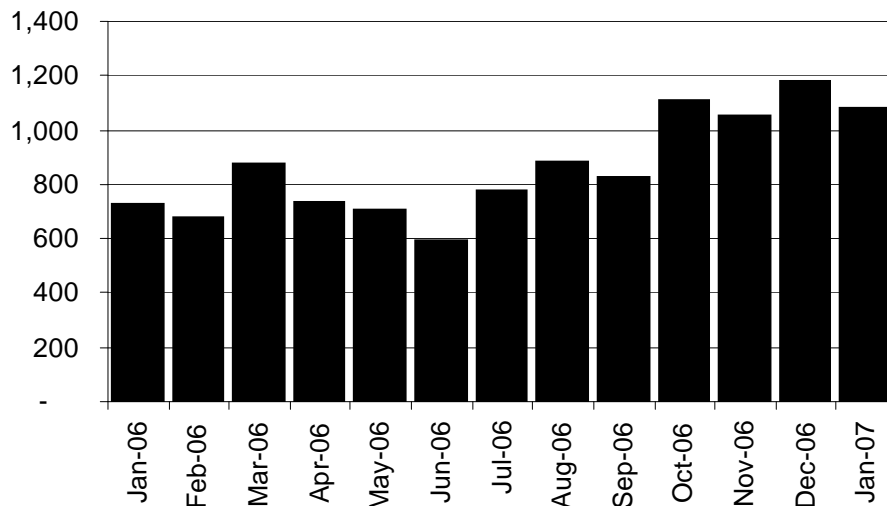
The MPA funding round progresses and we understand that funding allocations for community engagement will be presented to the MPA's Coordination and Policing Committee on 1 March.

At its December meeting, the CPCG Board allocated £1,500 and £3,500 from this year's funding to a Youth recruitment event and to an analytic project around Domestic Violence recording, respectively. In both cases we shall be seeking additional funding.
