# KEY FACTS ON MENTAL ILLNESS

- Severe mental health problems, such as schizophrenia affect around one in 200 people.
- Depression, anxiety and phobias can affect up to one in six of the population at any one time

- Offences committed by people suffering from mental illness
- Guidance re the restraining of patients

### The Mental Health Act states:

- (1) 'If a constable finds in a place to which the public have access a person who appears to him/her to be suffering from mental disorder and to be in immediate need of care or control, the constable may, if s/he thinks it necessary to do so in the interests of that person or for the protection of other persons, remove that person to a place of safety
- (2) A person removed to a place of safety under this section may be detained there for a period not exceeding 72 hours for the purpose of enabling him/her to be examined by a registered medical practitioner and to be interviewed by an approved social worker and of making any necessary arrangements for his treatment or care'

### Place of Safety

The designated place of safety is:

Section 136 Suite (Eden Ward) Lambeth Hospital

or

Maudsley Hospital

Police Station. To be used only as a last resort.

The officer completes a form detailing the reason for use of the power, identifying the person and the time and date at which the power was used.

## How long do police stay with the patient?

The decision about how long police will remain at the hospital with a section 136 patient is that of the duty officer and senior medical person present.
