No Deal

- **21st September 2006 to 20th October 2006**
- **Stop & Account 201 persons .**
- **Resulting in Stop & Search of 167 persons.**
- **38 of those searched arrested. Search arrest rate 22.8%**
- **Total number arrested during the period was 74.**
- **The offences for which persons were arrested are varied 47.3% were drugs offences;**
- **6.7 % for dishonesty (theft type offences);**
- **10.8% violence and public order offences;**
- **35.2% other.**
- **The majority of those searched being in the age range of 21 years and 45 years (80.2%).**

Murders 2006

- **Matthew Smith** **Colmer Road, Streatham – 7 Arrested in relation to the murder , 3 charged with murder Trial to start 9/11/2006**
- **Thomas Fahey** **Victim shot during an attempted armed robbery 24/06/05. He died as a result of his injuries 30-1-06. 2 charged with murder and robbery. Trial set 06/11/2006.**
- **Michael Gallagher** **27/02/2006 The victim was stabbed found by member of public on his own doorstep in Broxholm Road**
- **Suspect pleaded guilty to manslaughter and this plea has been accepted by the Crown Court. He will be sentenced on 9.11.06 at the Central Criminal Court.**

- **Khizar Hayat & Hamidullah Hamidi** On 27/04/2006 a male threw a petrol bomb into the venue. 1 charged with murder Fitness to plead hearing set for 1st December 2006
- **Raymond Mayne** Victim stabbed 06/05/2006 Vauxhall Grove 2 Charged with Murder Case conference set for 9/11/06
- **Paul Owens (aka OWOTURO)** Victim stabbed 10/05/2006 Norfolk House Road by flatmate 1 Charged with murder Trial date set 22/1/2007.
- **Simon Montenior** Victim died on 11/05/2006 single stab wound to chest in Stockwell Road. No suspect identified to date. Fresh Media Campaign set for November
- **Alex Mulumba Kamondo** On 08/06/2006 Stabbed O/S Black Prince PH 2 charged with murder. Trial set for 05/03/2007

- **Mark Murphy** On 22/08/2006 at 24, Bournevale Road, London, SW16 Victim stabbed. 1 Suspect charged remanded in custody to Central Criminal Court on 30/11/2006 No updates
- **Carmelita TULLOCH** On 05/09/2006 she received a fatal stab wound to the chest. Wickham Street, Lambeth, SE11 1 suspect charged
- **04/12/2006** next mention date at Croydon Crown Court

Power of Dispersal

Section 30 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003

- Power to Disperse groups of 2 or more and return them to their place of residence
- Under 16 unsupervised in public places after 9pm
- Written authorisation by Superintendent
- Significant , persistent anti-social behaviour
- Causing Intimidation, Harassment, Alarm or Distress
- At that location to the Public
- By the presence or behaviour of groups.

What constitutes Intelligence led?

- **Example**
- Victim Robbed Brixton Hill
- Description circulated via PR
- Suspect fitting description stopped in the locality

- **This is Intelligence Led Policing**

What is an arrest?

- Arrest is the depriving someone of their liberty by putting them into custody under lawful authority
- Balanced against the intrusion on peoples human rights
- Consideration
- Legality
- Proportionality
- Necessity

Powers of Arrest - new powers

- Section 110 of the Serious Organised Crime and Police Act 2005
- Amended the powers of arrest available to a constable under section 24 of the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984.
- Prior to this the powers of arrest concept of seriousness attached to the offence

What can Police arrest for?

- Police can arrest for any offence where **Certain Criteria** apply

When Police can Arrest

- A constable may arrest without a warrant:-
- At many points during the commission of an offence
- From
- anyone who is about to commit an offence;
- To
- If an offence has been committed, anyone who is guilty of the offence;



Criteria - For arresting

- Unable to Ascertain Persons Name or Address
- Prevent causing injury to themselves or another
- Prevent causing loss or damage to property
- Prevent causing an offence against public decency
- Unlawful obstruction of the road
- Protect a child or vulnerable from the person
- To allow prompt and effective investigation
- To prevent person disappearing



The Penalty Notice for Disorder scheme

- Alternative means of disposal
- For low-level, anti-social and nuisance offending.
- PND



PND - Payment or Trial

- Once issued the suspect must either pay the amount shown on the notice or request a hearing.
- This must be done within the (statutory) 21 days
- Payment involves no admission of guilt and removes the creation of a record of criminal conviction. (They will be recorded on the Police National Computer)
- The penalty notice includes instructions on how to ask for a trial.



PND - What offences? How much ?

- Fireworks
- Section 5 Public order
- Wasting Police Time giving false report
- Theft (retail under £200)
- Criminal damage(under £500)
- Throwing Fireworks
- Some Alcohol related offences
- £80 fine

- Drunk in Highway
- Depositing Litter
- Some Alcohol related offence
- £50 fine



Custody suite: point of entry to custody:

- **Rights of detainee**
- Right to free independent legal advice
- Right to have someone informed of their arrest
- Right to have a copy of the codes of practice
- Taken through medical issues form to enable custody officer to care for the person's detained needs.
- Fingerprints photograph and DNA can be taken at this stage
- For some offences they can be subject to drug testing for class A



Powers to search premises:-

- Warrants to search issued by Magistrate
- Three powers to search after arrest



Disposals from custody

- Charge
- Caution
- Summons
- No further action
- PND
- Bailed

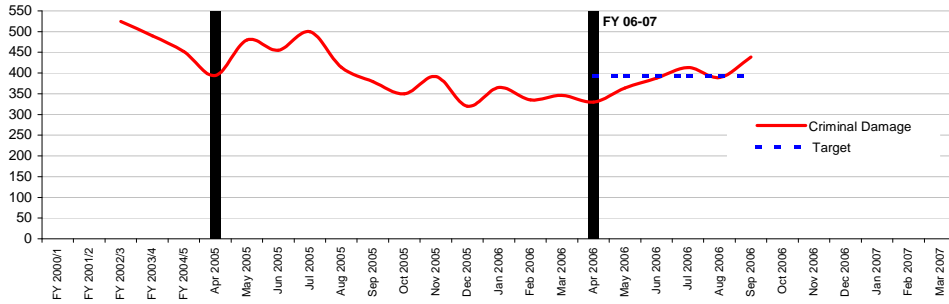

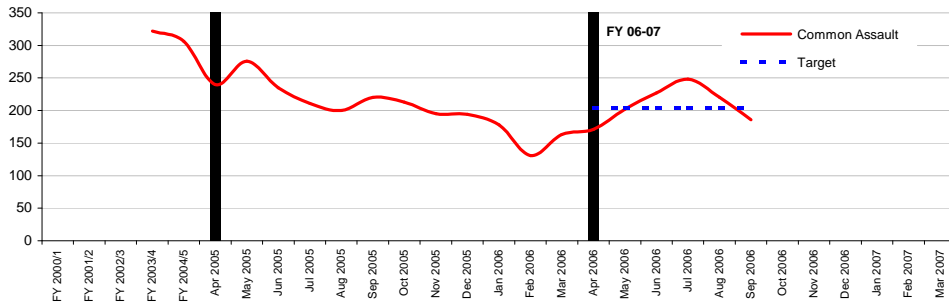
FY 05-06 Criminal Damage Offences

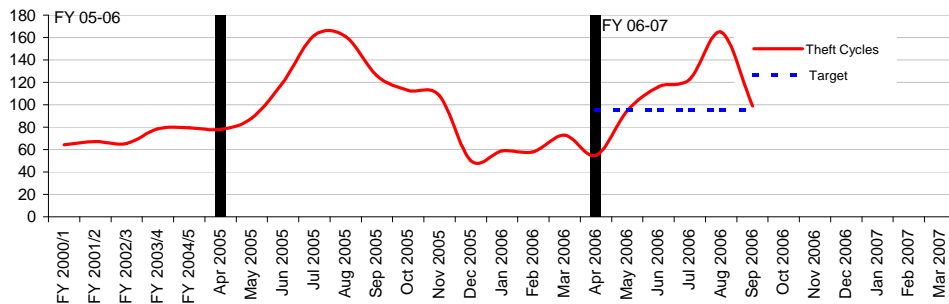
FY 05-06 Common Assault Offences

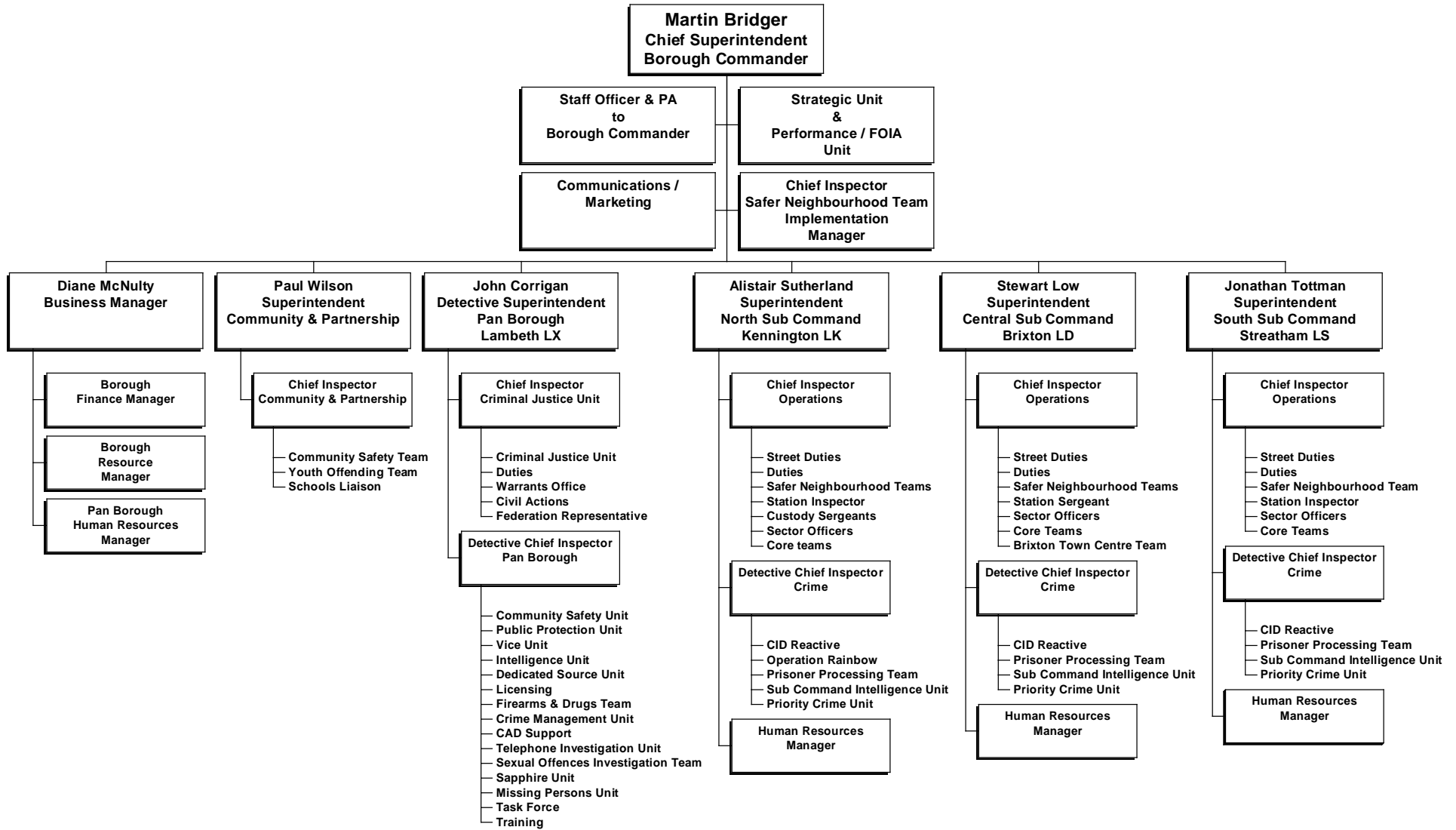
Theft Cycle Offences

Glossary

'Sanctioned' and 'Non Sanctioned' Detection Definitions

A 'Sanctioned' Detection is where an allegation has resulted in either a charge, a summons, a caution, a formal warning, a youth reprimand or an offence being taken into consideration i.e. in addition to the charge for which the person is before a court, other offences can be admitted by the defendant and the court asked to take these offences into consideration in passing sentence.

A 'Non-Sanctioned' Detection is where a crime has been committed and recorded and:

A suspect has been identified and interviewed by a police officer or, if an interview is not necessary to determine guilt, had at least been informed that the offence has been detected.

There must be sufficient evidence to charge the suspect with the crime.

If the victim subsequently refuses to give evidence, then a reason for this decision has been documented.

In the case where there is an identifiable victim, the victim must have been informed that the crime has been detected or in the case of a child, the parent or guardian has been informed.

Total Robbery

Combination of Robbery and Theft-Snatch

Robbery

Theft where force or threat of force is made to a person at the time or immediately before in order to steal

Theft - Snatch

Theft where force is applied to the object carried by a person ie snatching an handbag or phone from a person

Motor Vehicle Crime

Combination of theft from vehicles or taking of vehicles with the owners consent or theft of a motor vehicle

Gun Enabled Crime

A crime which is a specific listed offence ie assaults, thefts or sexual offences whilst in possession of a firearm or imitation firearm and the firearm has been seen or used

ABH

Assault where cuts bruises and other types of minor injuries are sustained

GBH

Serious assault resulting in permanent injury broken bones

TNO Total Notifiable Offences

All notifiable offences which are recorded by police and a crime report is generated

I-Call

Police graded response to a call received in the Police Control Room. Immediate response within 12mins. For incidents where a suspect is still on scene/nearby or immediate danger is perceived

CAD

Computer aided dispatch which is the computer system used within Metropolitan Police Control rooms to record incidents
