Performance

- Most Serious Violence 202 offences
- Serious Acquisitive Crime 14 % reduction 650 fewer offences
- Robbery 14.4% reduction 159 fewer offences
- Residential Burglary 9.6% reduction 127 fewer offences
- Gun Crime 44.1% reduction 49 fewer offences
- Knife Crime 10.5 % reduction 39 fewer offences
- Youth Violence 7.1% reduction 34 fewer offences
- Vehicle Crime 15.5% reduction 324 fewer offences
- Total Notifiable Offences 3.6% reduction 649 fewer offences
- Domestic Violence 6.8% increase 73 more offences
- Racist Crime 4.8% increase 7 more offences

Cash in Transit Robbers Found Guilty

- Terry Wallace, Leroy Wilkinson, Victor Iniodu , Adrian Johnson, Brian Henry, Leon McKenzie and Leroy Hall were part of a criminal network organised by Mark Nunes with Andrew Markland - Nunes and Markland were fatally shot by Police on Thursday 13 September 2007.
- The seven defendants all from South London were found guilty of a total of 18 robberies and attempted robberies across the south of England between April 2006 and September 2007.
- They targeted cash-in-transit guards and stole approximately £500,000.
- A number of the robberies involved the use of guns. On one occasion a shot was discharged and during another two offences a gun was placed to a guard's head. A loaded 9mm handgun was recovered from the scene of the Chandlers Ford robbery.
