## **TSG Open Day**

- 5 Area Territorial Support Group (TSG5) opened its doors for an open day on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> November from 10am – 3pm.
- The open day consisted of a talk by Inspector Renton, a presentation on chemical, biological, radioactive, nuclear (CBRN), a Taser, officer safety techniques and briefing demonstration as well as a tour around the facilities and TSG carrier.
- This unique opportunity gave the community of Lambeth a chance to see how the TSG, which is a London-wide police unit, supports borough teams, specialist crime teams, the anti-terrorist branch and firearms officers.

## **Personal Safety Advice to Businesses**

- On Thursday 13th November officers from Prince's Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) delivered three one-hour presentations to staff from the Health Professional Council on personal safety.
- PC Steve Lockyer and PC Sean Hannon delivered a presentation, which incorporated personal safety advice, local crime performance and current crime trends to 45 delegates. The information presented, highlighted the simplest things to make their journey to and from work safer. Equipped with new knowledge and awareness about personal safety the delegates left the presentation informed and confident.
- This is the 5th personal safety presentation Prince's SNT have delivered. Local businesses work in partnership with their local SNT to give their staff the opportunity to engage with local officers and learn about personal safety for their journeys to and from work.

## **Knights Hill and Thurlow Park SNT**

- On Wednesday 5th November officers from Knights Hill and Thurlow Park Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNT) recovered a silver revolver whilst out on a routine patrol.
- PC Swinburn and PCSO'S Tanner, Cloke and McMahon were patrolling the York Hill Estate when they saw a male acting suspiciously after coming out of a bin shed. They approached the man and spoke to him; PC Swinburn then conducted a search of the bin shed. The search revealed a black carrier bag; inside the bag was a silver revolver with two rounds of ammunition, a kitchen knife was also found.
- The man was arrested for possession of a firearm and has been bailed to return in 9th January 2009.

## **Margaret Doswell – MPS Volunteer**

- The Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) held a major event at the prestigious Royal Festival Hall on the Southbank, to thank its volunteers for their contribution to making London safer.
- A volunteer from Lambeth Margaret Doswell was recognised for her efforts. Margaret currently works at Brixton Police Station's front counter triage.
- The event was held on the evening of Monday 10th November in the Main Auditorium of the Royal Festival Hall. Over a thousand guests from both the Met Special Constabulary and the Met Volunteer Programme were invited and recognition was given to outstanding contributions by volunteers in the police.

## **Coldharbour Ward**

- A small team of officers have begun to deliver the Diamond initiative on Coldharbour Ward.
- The aim is to increase community cohesion and drive down crime via joint working with the London Probation Service and resettlement workers from Lambeth Borough.
- The Team will target and supervise those released from short prison sentences, to return home to the Ward. The aim is to cut re-offending by this problematic yet currently unsupervised group through day to day intervention in their lives.
- The joint approach allows for those who want to move on from a life of offending almost instant access to people who have the skills to cement and assist with that decision.
- The team will also ensure rigorous supervision of people living on the Ward who have been made subject of an unpaid work order by the Courts.

## Lambeth Fireworks

- On Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> November 2008 at 1930hrs, a 30-minute duration firework display took place simultaneously at three Lambeth venues, Clapham Common, Streatham Common and Brockwell Park. The displays were organised and run by Festival Fireworks on behalf of the London Borough of Lambeth and entry was free.

## Oval, Princes & Bishops Ward

- **Oval Ward** The interim ASBO Order for Ritzy Teshiana (Kennington Park Estate) was converted to a full order on the 27th November
- **Princes Ward** Operation Reclaim - targeted enforcement at uninsured vehicles and unlicensed drivers. Over the last 14 days the combined efforts of the SNT's in the North have seized and removed from the streets of Lambeth in excess of 20 vehicles
- **Bishops Ward** Drugs raid China Walk Estate. Intelligence generated from the SNT and the warrant executed by the Taskforce and TFL led to the seizure of an estimated 25k of heroin.



## Dispersal Zone in Waterloo

- Bishops Ward SNT working with Community Safety to introduce a Section 30 Dispersal Order in Waterloo for duration of six months.
- It is envisaged that the order will go live from 5<sup>th</sup> Jan 2009
- Waterloo has recently suffered from a rise in crime, anti social behaviour, street drinking and rough sleeping as a result of an increase in the street population.
- Many of these individuals are migrant workers from the A10 Accession states of Eastern Europe who have been affected by the recession and subsequent downturn in the building industry. They have no recourse to public funds - which included treatment services and accommodation and are therefore destitute on the streets of Waterloo
- We will be working in close collaboration with our partners including Thames Reach street population outreach team and Bishops Safer Neighbourhood officers to identify solutions on a case by case basis

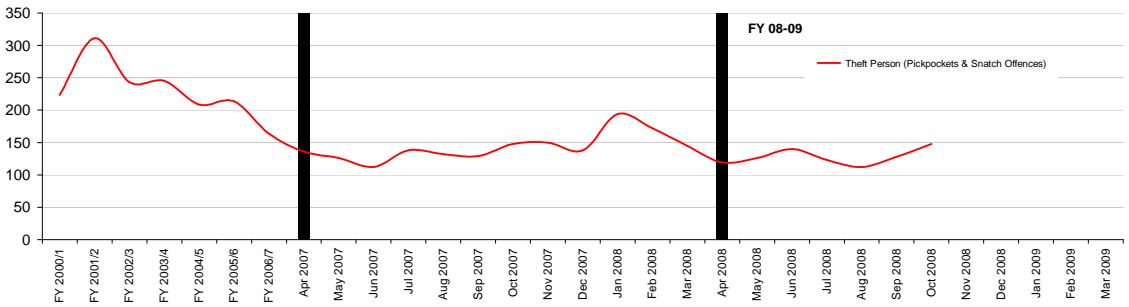

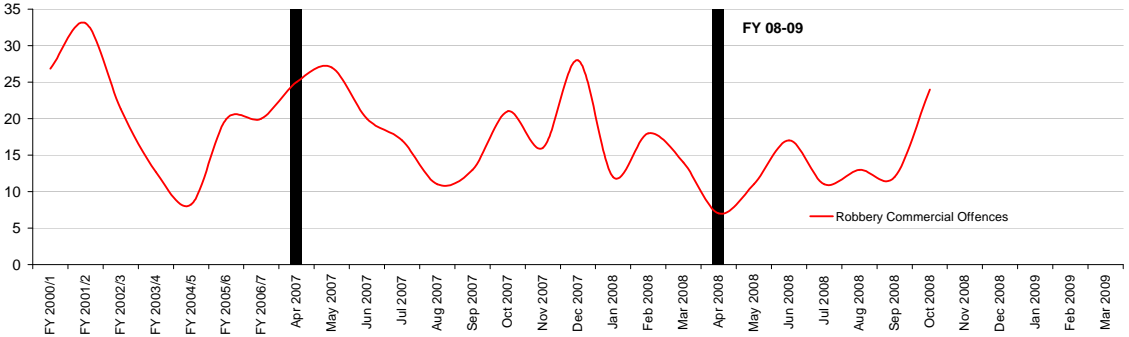

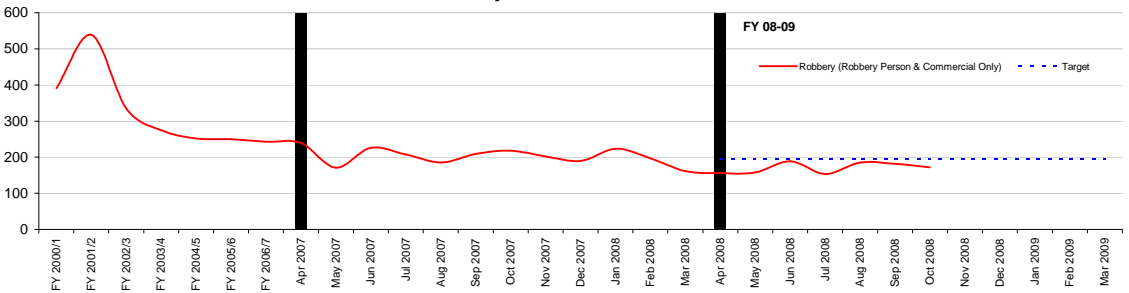

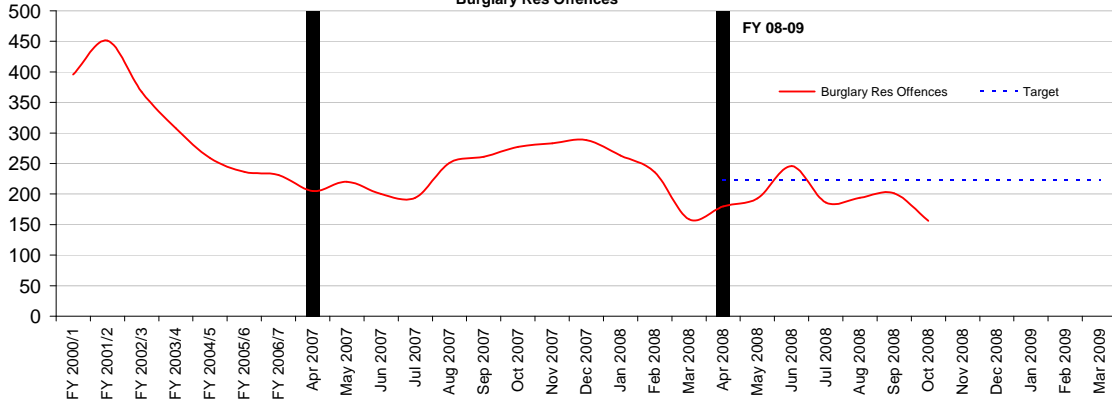

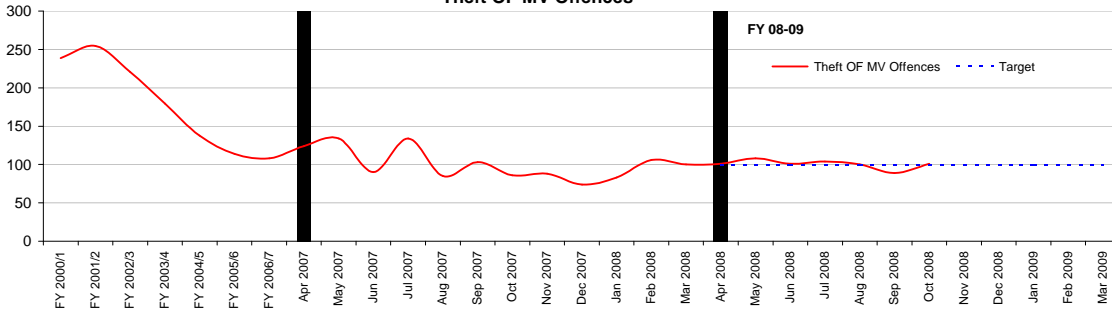

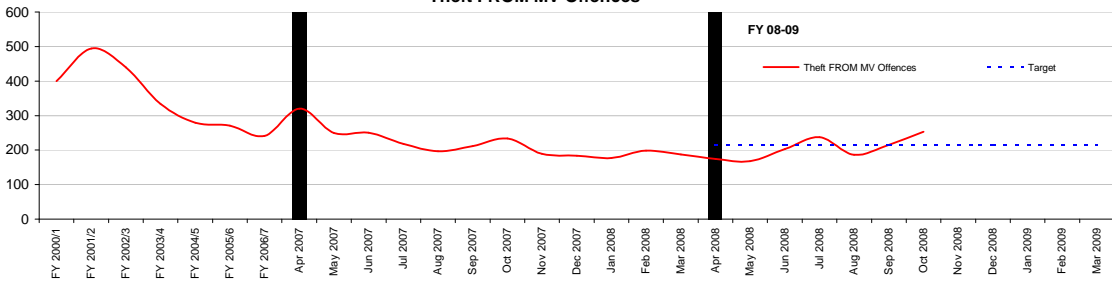

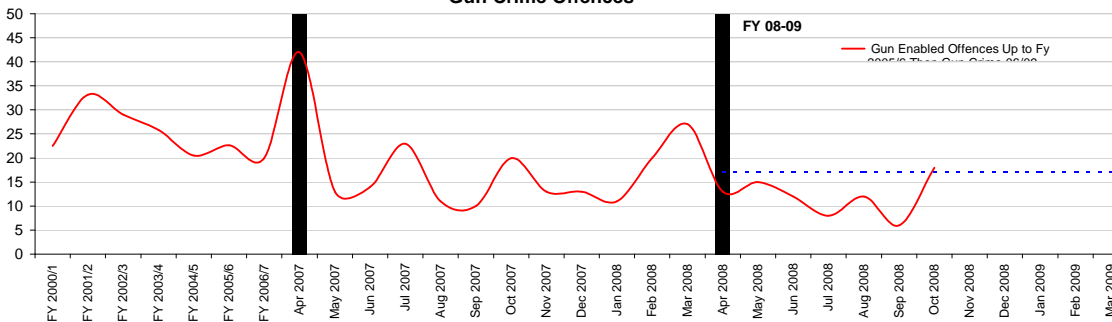
### Theft FROM MV Offences

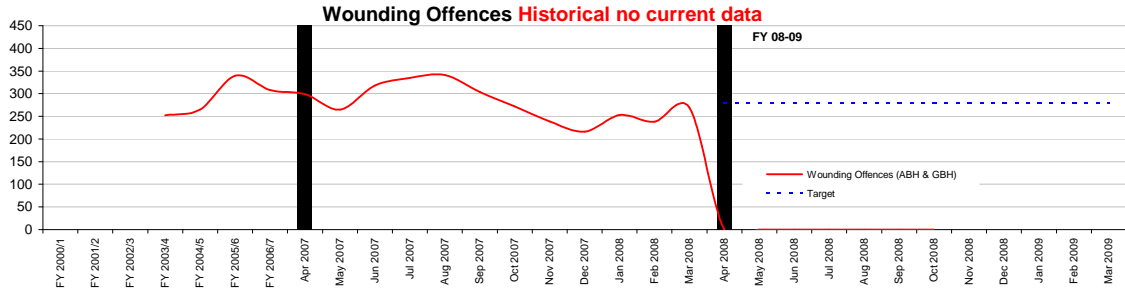

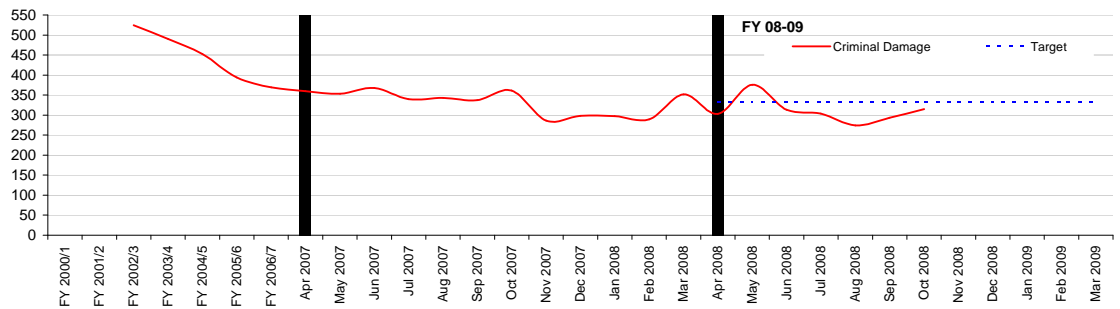

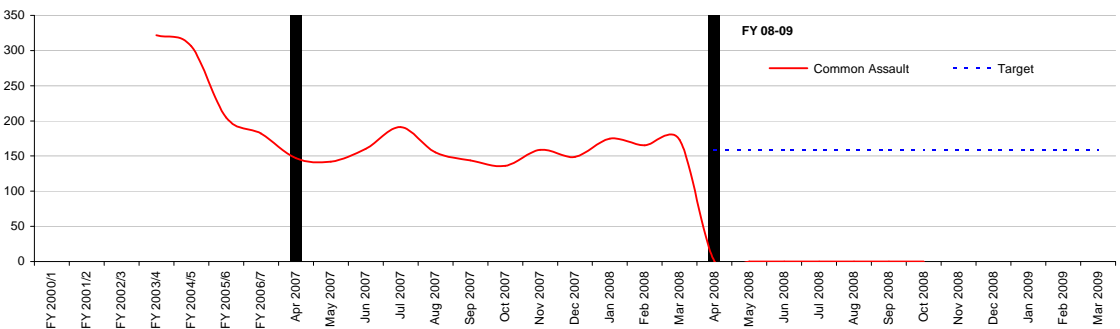

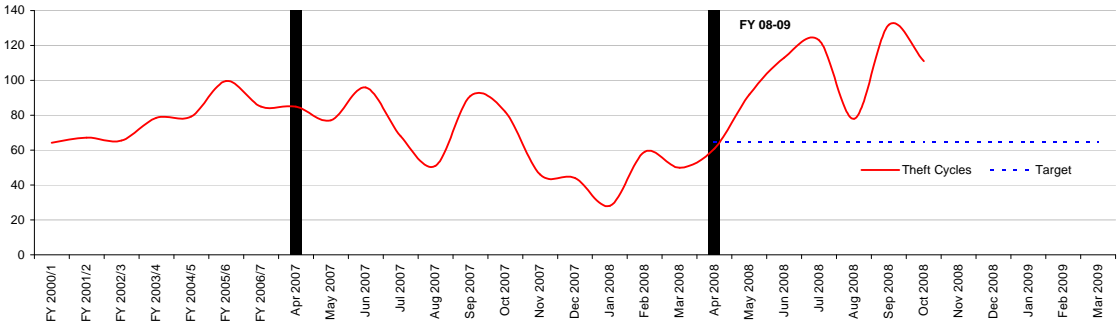
### Common Assault Offences Historical no current data

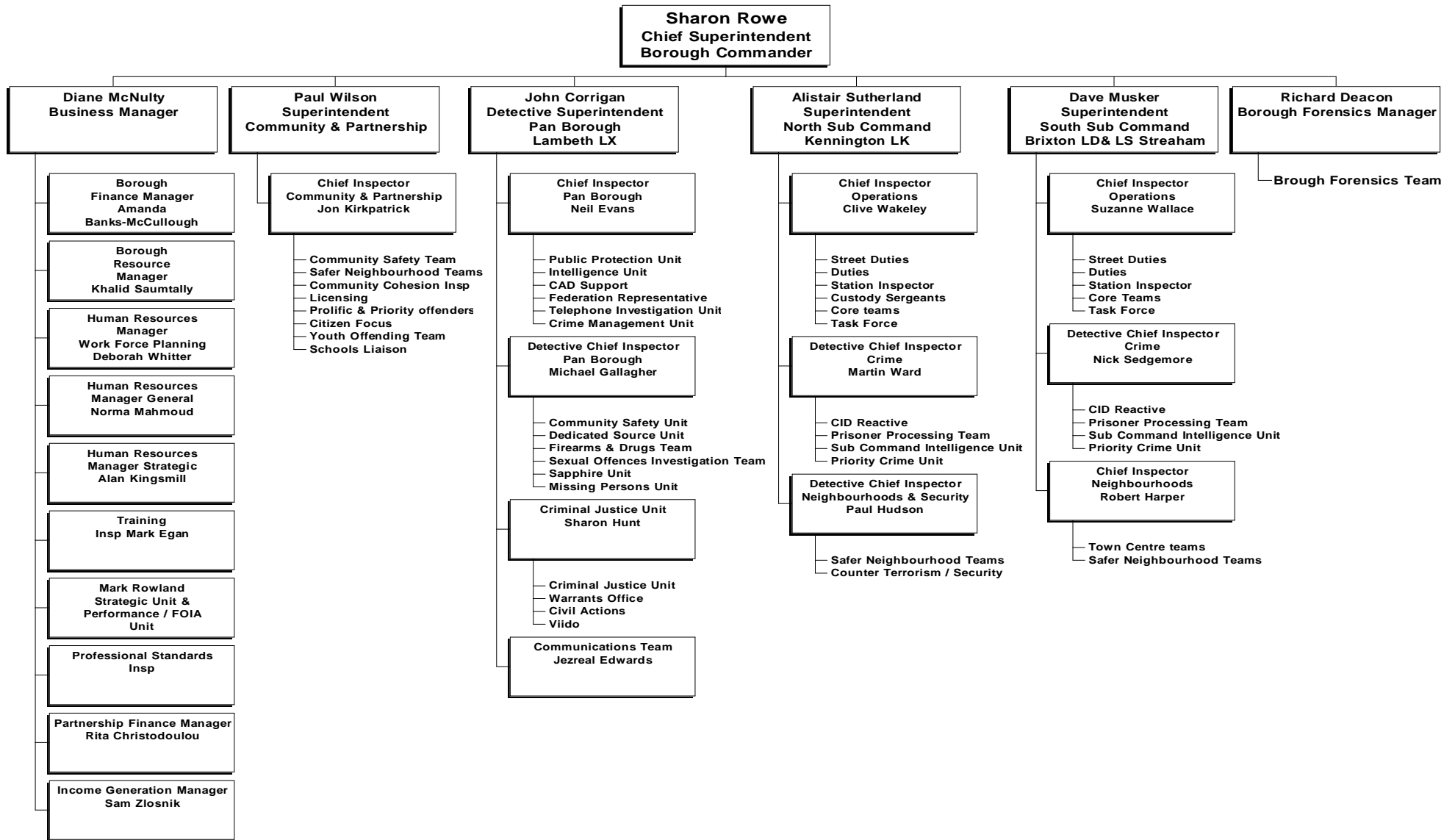

## **Glossary**

### **'Sanctioned' and 'Non Sanctioned' Detection Definitions**

A 'Sanctioned' Detection is where an allegation has resulted in either a charge, a summons, a caution, a formal warning, a youth reprimand or an offence being taken into consideration i.e. in addition to the charge for which the person is before a court, other offences can be admitted by the defendant and the court asked to take these offences into consideration in passing sentence.

A 'Non-Sanctioned' Detection is where a crime has been committed and recorded and: A suspect has been identified and interviewed by a police officer or, if an interview is not necessary to determine guilt, had at least been informed that the offence has been detected.

There must be sufficient evidence to charge the suspect with the crime.

If the victim subsequently refuses to give evidence, then a reason for this decision has been documented.

In the case where there is an identifiable victim, the victim must have been informed that the crime has been detected or in the case of a child, the parent or guardian has been informed.

### **Total Robbery**

Combination of Robbery and Theft-Snatch

### **Robbery**

Theft where force or threat of force is made to a person at the time or immediately before in order to steal

### **Theft - Snatch**

Theft where force is applied to the object carried by a person ie snatching an handbag or phone from a person

### **Motor Vehicle Crime**

Combination of theft from vehicles or taking of vehicles with the owners consent or theft of a motor vehicle

### **Gun Enabled Crime**

A crime which is a specific listed offence ie assaults, thefts or sexual offences whilst in possession of a firearm or imitation firearm and the firearm has been seen or used

### **ABH**

Assault where cuts bruises and other types of minor injuries are sustained

### **GBH**

Serious assault resulting in permanent injury broken bones

### **TNO Total Notifiable Offences**

All notifiable offences which are recorded by police and a crime report is generated

### **I-Call**

Police graded response to a call received in the Police Control Room. Immediate response within 12mins. For incidents where a suspect is still on scene/nearby or immediate danger is perceived

### **CAD**

Computer aided dispatch which is the computer system used within Metropolitan Police Control rooms to record incidents
